REPORT TO AFFILIATED SOCIETIES MID-AMERICA ORCHID CONGRESS OMAHA, NE, MARCH 19-21, 2010

The Spring Mid-America Orchid Congress met March 19-21, 2010, at the Marriott Regency Hotel in Omaha, Nebraska. The Greater Omaha Orchid Society Orchid Show, held at the Lauritzen Gardens in the Omaha Botanical Garden, complemented the Congress.

Although MAOC scheduled interesting speakers, attendance at MAOC was limited. The lectures featured Carson Whitlow's "The World of Cypripediums." Carson has grown Cypripediums for over 35 years, registering the first artificial hybrid in 1987. Also highlighting the event were: Scott Stewart, PhD, who discussed the past, present and future of orchid conservation; Ernie Gemeinhart, who encouraged light gardeners with practical tips on growing orchids under lights, and Doug Watson, who walked us through the history of the Congress with his delightful reminiscences of past members.

On Saturday morning, Joe Lankton ably guided the 18 judges in five ribbon teams and three AOS teams as they evaluated the 15 exhibits and 288 entries. The judges identified 29 orchids for award consideration and the following seven were successful:

1. Epidendrum cochlidium 'Benja', CHM/AOS, 82 pts--David Taylor, Hickman, NE
2. Ionocidium Popcorn 'Katherine Ann', JC/AOS (Oncidium flexuosum x Ionopsis utricularioides)--David Taylor, Hickman, NE

3. Paphiopedilum (Sander's Pride x adductum) 'Golden Boy' AM/AOS, 81 pts--Orchid Inn (Sam Tsui), Bloomington, IL
4. Phragmipedium caudatum 'Fox Valley', AM/AOS, 81 pts--Fox Valley Orchids, Ltd. (Tom Kalina), Villa Park, IL
5. Phragmipedium Devil Fire 'Joan Lorence', AM/AOS, 80 pts (Grande x warscewiczianum)--Jon Lorence, Solon, IA
6. Phragmipedium Wössner Supergrande 'Mem. Jean Lorence', AM/AOS, 82 pts (warscewiczianum x longifolium)--Jon Lorence, Solon, IA
7. Trichocentrum splendidum 'Mem. Gloria Janssen', HCC/AOS, 78 pts--Tim Janssen, Lincoln, NE

The exhibit created by the Orchid Society of Greater Kansas City received the AOS Show Trophy.

3. F. L. Stevenson Pleurothallid Alliance Award for the best Pleurothallid alliance plant: Lepanthes gargoyle owned by John Dolen (Greater Omaha Orchid Society)
4. Myron Banta Award for the best specimen plant: Lycaste Always owned by Natt's Orchids (Naperville, IL)

ACTIONS TAKEN BY MAOC:

- Conservation Committee awarded \$1200 in grants in Fall 2009. \$400 grants were awarded to McNeeley Conservatory (St. Paul MN), Wheeler Collection (Ball State University) & Cleveland Botanical Garden.
- MAOC donated \$4,000 to AOS in 2009.
- New Appointments: Beth Martin, Chair of Annual Meeting Committee; Tim Brooks, Chair of Orchidist of the Year Committee.
- Fall MAOC meeting September 24-26, 2010, in Louisville, KY.
- Saturday night's auction raised \$2,083.

SUPPORTING ORCHID CONSERVATION

- Contribute 1% of annual budget to conservation causes, e.g., Orchid Conservation Coalition www.orchidconservationcoalition.org
- Society has a native orchid bed at local nature center. Raises funds to support project
- Assist counting & cataloging native orchids in local area
- MAOC Conservation Committee will help fund collection of species at botanical gardens & accepts donations to pay \$300 for Conservation Speaker at Fall MAOC
- Support the Native American Orchid Plant Society; The Nature Conservancy & other conservation groups.
- Attend Native Orchid Conference
- Partner with a federal rescue center

CONSERVATION OF PERSONAL COLLECTIONS

- KEY: Step 1: PLAN; Step 2: DOCUMENT PLAN; Step 3: APPOINT person to execute plan. Time is paramount. Do not delay in executing plans – your orchids cannot wait
- Plan for natural disasters as well as the inability to care for orchids due to poor health or death
- Keep a list of orchids in collection. Estimate value

- Members of local society may assist in selling/distributing orchids
- Donate orchids to college or botanical garden -- contact first to confirm institution's desire to acquire your orchids
- Sell "select" orchids through judging center
- Sell orchids to society members, returning money to family or to society for specific purpose: speakers fund, etc
- Sell or will orchids to commercial vendor
- Post on Orchid Mall
- Divide plants and distribute to members of society

RECRUITING YOUNG MEMBERS:

- Encourage young people: add a "junior exhibit" to show schedule- award a ribbon; give a raffle plant; recycle ORCHIDS magazines; give a gift certificate, plant etc. from local vendor to junior who sets up a display

Dear Fellow Orchid Growers,

Our spring Mid-America meeting is over -- more about it later. We're looking forward to the fall meeting, which will be held in conjunction with the Kentucky Orchid Society's Fall Orchid Show, in Louisville, September 24-26. Mid-America will once again be hosting the Congress activities, but we are doing a couple things differently this time. In Omaha, several people commented that they'd like a little more free time in the schedule; that Saturdays are particularly hectic. So in Louisville, we are going to have only two speakers, with the first at 2:00 pm. That will leave an extra hour for the judges to finish their work and for the rest of us to see the Show and visit the vendors. For a special treat, we're going to have our dinner at Winston's, a world class restaurant.

As most of you know, our spring meeting in Omaha was hosted by Mid-America. This was only the second time we've done this, and by most measures it was a success. There were interesting talks, the usual good fellowship; the Congress business got done, and the meeting was a financial success. All the numbers are not yet in, but it appears that we broke even or possibly made a couple hundred dollars, and on top of that the auction brought in just over \$2,000. The only disappointment was the lower-than-hoped-for attendance. On the positive side, we were able to host a Mid-America and not lose money even with the low registration numbers.

The consensus of the Executive Committee was that the reason for the low attendance was that Omaha was too far to drive for most people, and many did not want to purchase a plane ticket in this economy. If we're right, then attendance should be strong in Louisville. It's a six hour drive or less from most Mid-America affiliated societies, and September is a great time for a road trip!

FALL 2010 MID-AMERICA ORCHID CONGRESS LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY

Please join us at Mid-America's Fall meeting, hosted by The Mid-America Orchid Congress and held in conjunction with the Kentucky Orchid Society's 2010 Fall Orchid Show, September 24-26, 2010. Both Mid-America and the orchid show will be at the Fern Valley Hotel and Conference Center, Louisville, Kentucky. Louisville is within driving distance of much of the Mid-America region. We hope you'll take this opportunity to visit with old orchid friends and make some new ones.

We're looking forward to the Saturday afternoon lectures. To allow judges time to complete AOS judging before the lectures, our speakers will begin at 2:00pm. Marni Turkel of Stony Point Ceramic Design will present *Give It a Rest*. This talk will explore some of the factors involved in providing the dry rest period that many orchids receive in their native habitats. Learn about the effects of weather on cultural needs, and how to investigate climate and habitat to become a better orchid grower. Marni's travel expenses are funded by the Shirley Burr Moore Memorial Fund of the Mid-America Orchid Congress.

Our second speaker is Fred Clarke, owner of Sunset Valley Orchids in San Diego, California. Attend Fred's talk, *Today's Mini and Compact Cattleyas*, to learn about the small-growing *Cattleya* species, what hybrids are available, and how to grow these little gems. Then visit Fred's sales tables at the Orchid Show.

Saturday evening festivities will begin with the Mid-America auction, our main fundraising event.

The Mid-America dinner in Louisville will be a treat! Be sure to sign up for dinner at Winston's Restaurant, Sullivan University's highly rated restaurant where culinary students refine their skills before stepping out as professional chefs. In 2007, Winston's Restaurant was named the best teaching restaurant facility in the country by the American Culinary Federation (ACF).

Take advantage of the Affiliated Societies Breakfast on Sunday morning -- Society delegates always leave this Breakfast full of information and ideas to take home to their orchid societies. After breakfast, delegates will convene for the Mid-America business meeting. The business meeting is open to all, and anyone wanting more information about Mid-America is welcome to attend.

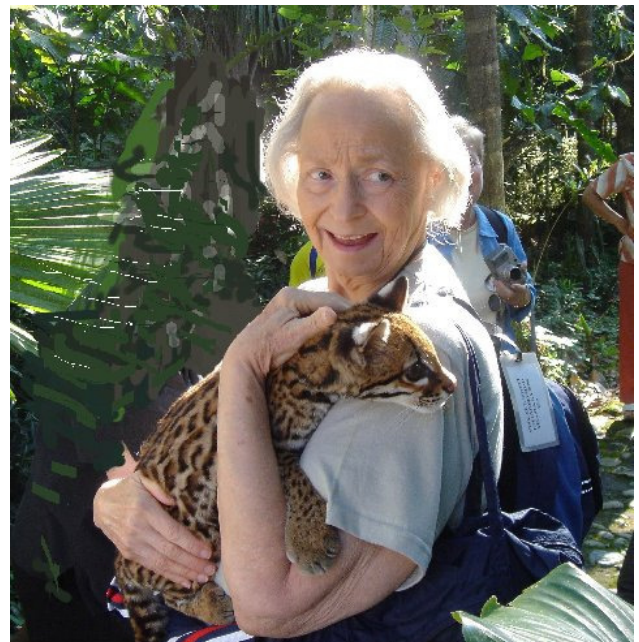

ANNALEE BOYETT

The Mid-America Orchid Congress lost part of our history when AnnaLee Boyett passed away on the morning of January 14, 2010. AnnaLee served as president of the Congress in 1986-1987, succeeding Tom Harper, who presided 1984-1985, and was herself succeeded by Lois Holmes, who was President 1988-1989. Wearing her presidential gold crown, she presided over Congresses October 1986, hosted by the Atlanta Orchid Society, Atlanta, GA, April 1987, hosted by the Orchid Society of Middle TN, Nashville, TN and in October 1987, hosted by the Southern Ontario Orchid Society, Toronto, Ont.



AnnaLee joined the American Orchid Society in January 1972, became a Certified Judge in March 1979 and served as a judge for thirty years until her retirement in April 2009. She served for a time as the AOS Judging Committee Chair and also Trustee. In addition, she was a long-time member of the Atlanta Orchid Society, serving the organization in countless ways, including President in 1978.

Doug Hartong, who met her the first time he attended an Atlanta Society meeting, attributes his becoming a student judge to AnnaLee's continuing encouragement and friendship. Hermann Pigors recalls AnnaLee as a very good leader and a true asset to the Congress. Doug Watson characterizes her as "a classically sweet, charming, adorable southern lady on the exterior, but a strong willed, forceful, and determined leader."

Our condolences go out to her husband, Ed, and to the rest of her family. We, too, shall miss her.
